Seniors Honored at Foundation Event

The Edgewood foundation held its twentieth annual Senior Recognition Celebration on May 15. The class of 2005, 19 students graduating from four high schools and moving on to at least nine different colleges, was honored at a brunch dedicated to the memory of Bill Limpert, who initiated the tradition in 1986.

Former Edgewood resident David Conrad was the featured speaker. A successful actor with numerous movie and television credits, David had returned home to perform in *Henry IV* with the Pittsburgh Irish & Classical Theater. At the final performance, the night before the brunch, David fell on stage in Act I and broke his hand, but both that show and the brunch went on true to theatrical tradition.

David told the graduating seniors, "Edgewood might seem small to you now, but beauty only exists in a frame. After I left I began to notice as time went by that the best people I met were from places like Pittsburgh, and places like Edgewood."

David went on to say, "The world of fear we live in is so sad, and in Edgewood we've chosen to say we're confident. We trust each other, and we're comfortable with that." He also advised the graduates to "keep your Pittsburgh accents – in your heart even if you don't always have it in your voice."

Jay Bush served as master of ceremonies. Mayor Jean Davin gave the invocation, and Council President Mitchell Brouman presented the graduates with certificates.

A special presentation of music with lyrics by Marty and Mary Reidell and sung by Patrick Cooksey accompanied a show of photographs compiled by Conn Thieman. Cameron Doyle entertained with piano music throughout the event.

Shady Characters Wanted for Tree Survey

There are TK trees in Edgewood. Journalists will recognize this old joke about relying on researchers – TK means "to come," and its use suggests that someone – someone other than the reporter, that is – will get the information.

In this case, that someone might be you – with a little help from the Edgewood Foundation, the Edgewood Garden Club, the Nine Mile Run Watershed Association, and the Penn State Cooperative Extension Service. These groups are working together to take a tree inventory in the borough of Edgewood.

The borough is conducting an initial survey for planting and maintenance planning, but the inventory planned by these groups will be more thorough.

Knowledge about our trees and green spaces is important, because they can improve property values by as much as nine percent, according to the Wharton School of Business. Also, the storm water and pollution problems plaguing Nine Mile Run can be remedied, at least in part, by cultivating a well-managed urban forest, which includes the trees planted all along our streets and sidewalks.

A meeting for those interested in helping with this survey will be held on Wednesday, June 22 at 6 p.m. in council chambers at the borough building. The inventory is scheduled to start in the fall.




