## Comprehensive Planning Process Underway

JUNE/JULY 2007

Nearly 70 Edgewood residents attended the planning meeting held in May at the Western Pennsylvania School for the Deaf. The goal of the meeting was to obtain residents' input on issues vital to the future of the borough.

Edgewood is working on developing a Comprehensive Plan with Swissvale and Rankin. When complete, the Comprehensive Plan will serve as a land use plan for borough council, staff and volunteers. According to Pashek Associates, multi-municipal cooperation creates a clear, unified vision for the region, allows more enables joint municipal ordinances, encourages coordinated approaches to economic development, and enhances environmental quality.

Consultants from Pashek Associates led an interactive discussion of Edgewood's strengths, needs and goals for the future. Facilitators listed all ideas on flip charts, then gave citizens a method to put their money where their mouths were: sheets of garage sale price stickers were handed out, and participants assigned value to the various issues discussed, with a \$20 sticker being worth \$200,000 down to \$1,000 for a ten-cent sticker. Citizens could divide their money among several issues, or go for broke on one they considered top priority.

Among the most important issues chosen (in no particular order) were public safety, economic development of Parcel D and the Edgewood Avenue business district, traffic control and maintaining the character of the borough.

Pashek Associates will now crunch the numbers to see which issues are highest in priority. Similar meetings were held in Rankin and Swissvale, and when all the data is assembled, the consultants will hold a meeting with all three boroughs, most likely sometime in the fall.

of which one resulted in personal injury, and nine resulted in property damage.

Part I Crimes are the more serious crimes of homicide, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft and arson. Of the 26 Part I Crimes committed in the borough, two were motor vehicle thefts, two were burglaries, two were shoplifting incidents and 11 were other crimes.

There were nine adult and three juvenile arrests made for felony and misdemeanor violations.

Edgewood officers wrote a total of 111 traffic citations, 140 parking citations and made three arrests for driving under the influence. There were three vandalism/criminal mischief complaints and no narcotics offenses.

Officers also responded to 10 false alarm calls, took 402 reports, responded to 42 public nuisance complaints, wrote one non-traffic citation and responded to 18 calls for medical assistance.



## **Annual 5K Race Up and Running for 2007**

It's time once again to tie on your running shoes and head out to train for the annual Edgewood Community Day 5K Race and Walk on August 18.

This event is the traditional kick-off of Community Day, which continues after the race with a parade and a daylong festival at Koenig Field, topped off with a performance by the Edgewood Symphony Orchestra and a fireworks display.

Edgewood's 5K is known as one of the more challenging courses in the area. August weather tends to be hot, hazv and humid, and the original race committee threw in the fourth H: Hills. But as Frank Shorter once said, "Hill work is speed work in disguise." If you train on our course, your next flatter 5K will probably be a personal record.

The race starts at Koenig Field at 8:30 for walkers and 9 a.m. for runners. Non-running residents might want to plan their day around the street closings. The race course takes runners down Greendale Avenue, across New Street to West Swissvale Avenue, across Pennwood, up to Race and under the railroad underpass. Runners then turn right on Edgewood Avenue, run to Oakview, up Oakview to Chestnut, turn left on Elm, right on Linden, right on Maple, left on Beech, left on Locust, right on Hawthorne, left on Walnut, left on East Swissvale, back under the underpass to Pennwood, left on West Hutchinson, then left again on Little Race to return to the field.

Given that course, is it any wonder that race organizers are seeking volunteers to work at the corners, pointing runners in the right direction?
