Council Swears in Reese McCardle as Second Junior Council Person

Reese McCardle, a 17-year-old junior at Woodland Hills High School, was sworn in as Edgewood's second junior council person this fall.

An active participant in WHHS's gifted program, Reese is involved in Model UN and the World Affairs Council. He spent a month volunteering with the Student Conservation Association at the Delaware Watergap National Recreation Area working on trails throughout the park.

Perhaps as a stepping stone to his new role on council, Reese has been on Student Council for five years, and at press time, was awaiting the results of the current election, in which he was running for class president.

Reese says he applied for the junior council position "to gain the ultimate civics lesson on municipal government." Reese wants to be involved in politics in some way in the future, and is planning to study political sci-

ence. Right now, he's looking at Georgetown, George Washington, American, and Carnegie Mellon Universities.

Reese says that taking the oath of office from Mayor Jean Davin, shaking the council members' hands and "crossing over to the other side of that gate" were powerful experiences. "I'm looking forward to taking all I can from this," he said.

Reese credits Council Member Heidi McDonald, who first proposed the junior council program to Edgewood, with helping him learn the ropes.

In addition to his interest in politics, Reese is an amateur filmmaker who has had work shown at Pittsburgh Filmmakers' "Film Kitchen" event. He also runs cross country and track and shoots on the rifle team at Woodland Hills. Reese lives on Vine Street with his parents, Pat McArdle and Nancy Reese, and his younger sister Tess.

Four Candidates; Four Council Slots in November 6 General Election

In the November 6 General Election, three candidates will run for three four-year terms and one candidate for one two-year term on Edgewood Borough Council.

Running for the four-year seats are incumbent and current Council President Pat Schaefer (D), Nancy Price (R), and Scott Harding (R). Running for the two-year term is Ben Reynolds (D). At press time, the newsletter had information submitted by three of the candidates.

Pat Schaefer is living in the third Edgewood house in 20 years with her children, Katie and Andy Peters. She is a cancer research nurse at the Hillman Cancer Center. Pat has been on council since 2000, and has served as both vice president and president. She is the Edgewood representative to the Basins Group of 3 Rivers Wet

Weathe. Pat considers it an honor to represent Edgewood and to serve the community.

Nancy Price is running for council "to ensure that Edgewood remains the healthy and vibrant place to live, work and visit that it has always been." Nancy moved here with her family in the late 1950s, and has found Edgewoodians to have a strong sense of community pride that fosters both democratic values and civic participation.

Nancy has done doctoral work and holds an M.Ed. She has worked in education, welfare and probation, and has participated in a variety of Edgewood civic activities, including serving a term as president of the Garden Club. She believes she ahs the insight and practical experience to collaborate with others to maintain the original vision for Edgewood.

Ben Reynolds comes from a family tradition of municipal service. His grandfather and father served as volunteer firemen, mayors and council members in what he calls "our tiny Iowa town," where Ben grew up on a farm. He spent four years in the Navy before studying to become a physician assistant. He is currently practicing in trauma and acute care surgery at UPMC Presbyterian. He has been married to his wife Raquel for three years and they have a daughter Elena.

Ben says that in three years, he and his family have become very attached to the tree-lined neighborhoods, the friendly people, the excellent police protection and an incredible and unique community spirit, which he has observed as both a resident and a volunteer fire fighter. His goal is to help Edgewood sustain its charms.

Crews arrived to find that a truck had driven into a pine tree and the driver was pinned inside the cab of the vehicle. Thanks to the expertise of Capt. Steve Halle, Lt. Doug Greer, Engineer Mark Ratajeski, driver Bruce Beitle, and firefighter Steve Krumholz, the driver is alive today. The equipment and knowledge this crew was armed with allowed the patient to be extricated and on the way to a trauma center in approximately 16 minutes. Swissvale FD, Forest Hills VFD and Woodland Hills EMS assisted EVFD. Everyone who was on scene that day deserves a great deal of credit for their extraordinary job they did.

State of the Watershed 2007

More than 120 people attended the State of the Watershed events held in early September. Participants learned about the history of Nine Mile Run, the current programs underway in the watershed, and how to make positive changes on their properties to improve the watershed for the future.

The Scientific Reports page of the NMRWA website contains several reports, one of which mentions the relative health of the street trees in Edgewood (particularly the pin oaks), which are responsible for absorbing 3,500 gallons of storm water runoff per year per tree, in addition to beautifying the neighborhood and adding to property values.

Rain Barrel Initiative 2007

One of NMRWA's main goals this year will be undertaking a study of the effectiveness of rain barrels as a method of controlling wet weather runoff that carries pollutants into Nine Mile Run.

Watershed residents residing in one of the study neighborhoods will receive free rain barrels including installation and technical support. All Nine Mile Run Watershed residents are encouraged to purchase their own barrels from the association below cost.


