





### July 2008 Activity Report

The Edgewood Police Department responded to and handled 1,433 calls for service in July 2008. There were 434 incidents reported, 188 complaints received and 10 accidents investigated, of which two resulted in personal injury, and eight resulted in property damage.

Part I Crimes are the more serious crimes of homicide, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft and arson. Of the 29 Part I Crimes committed in the borough, there were one burglary, 20 shoplifting incidents, and eight other crimes.

There were 11 adult and one juvenile arrests made for felony and misdemeanor violations.

Edgewood officers wrote a total of 51 traffic citations, 266 parking cita-

tions and made one arrest for driving under the influence. There were four vandalism/criminal mischief complaints and three narcotics offenses.

Officers also responded to 16 false alarm calls, took 246 reports, responded to 28 public nuisance complaints, wrote five non-traffic citations and responded to 12 calls for medical assistance.
