A Look Back As We Move Forward

Edgewood 2010 Budget Review: The borough collected an impressive 98.5% of its real estate taxes and over 109% of expected earned income taxes. Occupational privilege taxes in the borough increased 80% from 2009. The borough also collected increased revenues from athletic fees, advertising, rental properties (train station and Koenig Field apartment) and reimbursement for train station renovations incurred over the past couple years. Lower than expected revenues for fines and fees had a minor impact on the budget. Overall, the borough collected 105% of budgeted revenues for the year.

Department heads and borough employees worked hard to cut costs whenever possible and enabled the borough to come in under (an already tight) budget. Expenditures came in at or slightly under budget for legislative and administrative departments. Legal expenses increased due to many contract renewals and other legal

matters. Police, fire, and traffic safety departments all came in slightly under budget. Facility maintenance was over budget due to train station renovations which are now complete. Public Works department came in 20% under budget due to a worker's compensation claim. Recreation expenses were 40% under budget with no cuts in athletic programs. Public works equipment and snow and ice control were slightly over budget for 2010 due the extreme winter and the purchase of a new snow plow. Newsletter costs decreased by almost 20% from 2009. Overall, expenses for the year came in at 97.55% of budget.

The borough ended 2010 with \$207,309.53 in the general fund, which will allow current bills to be paid as tax revenue does not generally come in until after the first quarter. In January 2011, the borough transferred \$67,698.70 from the general fund to repay part of monies owed the sewer fund.

2011 brings new economic challenges as costs continue to rise in utilities, insurance and mandated state and federal programs, with increasingly limited state and federal funding. In anticipation of this, the roll out of the garbage and recycling fee in 2011 became necessary in order to maintain the current tax rate. We plan to address extensive maintenance issues in the borough building and increase our street paving program in 2011.



EVFD

Effective January 1, 2011 the International Building Code requires that a sprinkler system be installed in all newly constructed one and two family dwellings. The cost is approximately five dollars a square foot, which is about the same as carpeting. Although smoke detectors are a great warning device they do not extinguish a fire. In new construction, lightweight materials are used to keep the costs down. This type of construction is prone to early collapse under fire conditions. Flame is the activator, not smoke. Only the sprinkler head involved activates, not the entire system.


Sprinklers have been around for many years and have saved lives and property. In Edgewood we have had two incidents, that I am aware of, in which a sprinkler head was activated. Both times were in commercial occupancies. Had it not been for the sprinkler we would have had a much worse outcome. Police Report

The Edgewood Police Department would like to share with you ways to prevent burglaries - There are many things that citizens can do to make their home and neighborhood safer. One of the most important things that you can do as a citizen it to be observant. You know your neighbors, vehicles that belong in the area, and when something just looks wrong.

Always lock your windows and doors. You may think that your second story window is inaccessible, but is there a ladder lying around? A chair? How about on your neighbors property?

Many of the burglaries that we read about or see on the evening news have happened during the daytime. Leaving a T.V., radio, or light on may lead the perpetrator to believe that someone is home. The cost of powering a small radio pales in comparison to replacing your valuables.

Alarm systems are a valuable way to protect your home and family, even from fire. You may also have yard signs and window stickers letting criminals know that there is an alarm in use.

If you can see your big screen T.V. as you pull into your driveway, so can everyone else. It is a good idea to try to keep your valuables out of sight. This holds true with the win-

dows on the sides of your home as well. Motion lights are an excellent source of protection. Criminals are more hesitant when a light is turned on. These are just a few of the many things that you can do to protect yourself, your family, and your home. Edgewood Police Department officers have always tried to be proactive and share information with the citizens that we serve. We would like to offer residents an opportunity to meet with an officer at their residence. The officer will walk around the exterior of your home and provide pointers on what can be done to make your home safer. Nixle Community Information Service

Edgewood Borough has begun using a new system which will allow our residents to have immediate access to notable Edgewood Police events, safety, or community information. Borough officials are now able to send messages through the Nixle Community Information Service, which basically is a way of passing along important information. The information officials put into Nixle will be delivered to you instantly by cell phone, text message and/or email. The information will also be online at www. nixle.com. In order to receive the messages, you must register with Nixle. To register, go to the Borough website

(www.edgewoodboro.com), which has a link to the Nixle website. Once on the Nixle website, it will walk you through the simple registration process. You choose whether to receive the information on your computer or your cell phone. There is no cost for our residents to utilize this system. Edgewood Police officers have already utilized this system to relay information on the recent armed robberies in the Regent Square area, as well as seizure of a substantial amount of marijuana stemming from a traffic stop. There is a brochure available at the Borough Building about the Nixle System with detailed information.

Please talk to your neighbors about this new system so that as many people as possible can register and have access to important Borough information.

The Edgewood Police Department responded to and handled 1,655 calls for service in February 2009. There were 292 incidents reported, 148 complaints received and 12 accidents investigated, one of which resulted in personal injury, and 11 resulted in property damage.







Part I Crimes are the more serious crimes of Homicide, Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault, Burglary, Larceny, Motor Vehicle Theft and Arson. Of the 12 Part I Crimes committed in the Borough, there was one for Robbery, 0 for Motor Vehicle Theft, 0 for Burglary, 6 for Shoplifting, 3 for Aggravated Assault and 2 Other Crimes.

There were 13 adult and 2 juvenile arrests made for Felony and Misdemeanor violations.

Edgewood officers wrote a total of 34 Traffic Citations, 593 Parking Citations and 0 arrests for Driving Under the Influence were made. There were 2 Vandalism/Criminal Mischief Complaint and 2 Narcotics Offenses.

Officers also responded to 17 False Alarm Calls, took 215 reports, responded to 0 Public Nuisance Complaints, wrote 7 Non-Traffic Citations and responded to 16 calls for Medical Assistance.
