Reassessments Q & A:

A number of Edgewood residents have contacted the Borough with questions regarding the property reassessment appeals process and the impact on the 2013 millage.

In response, we are providing answers to those questions and resources to assist you in determining a course of action. This information is also on the Borough website.

How can I appeal my reassessment if I feel it's too high?

This must be done by the homeowner. If you intend to appeal your assessment values, you can obtain information from the County Website http://www2. alleghenycounty.us/reval/. The website provides information regarding your assessed property value and properties used in comparison. Those who wish to appeal their assessments should do so by April 2, 2012.

The county has offered to provide appeals workshops in various areas of the county. Edgewood Borough, in cooperation with the Western Pennsylvania School for the Deaf, has requested to have an appeals workshop here. We are awaiting a response from the county.

How do I determine if my taxes will increase or decrease?

The reassessed values for county property will affect the millage rates in Edgewood for the tax bills of the Borough, County and Woodland Hills School District that use property values to establish millage rates. As a general rule, if your property value increases by more than the average property in a taxing body, you will pay more taxes to that taxing body. If your new value

is less than the average, you will pay less. It will not affect the Borough's income tax rate of one percent.

What does the new reassessment mean for Borough millage rates?

The certified value of Edgewood Borough has yet to be confirmed. Due to the expected number of appeals, the certification we do receive will change following the appeals process. By state law, the millage rate for the Borough of Edgewood must be revenue neutral following utilization of the new assessment values. If the Borough council determines a need to increase the millage rate following reassessment, it must do so through a separate vote and the increase cannot exceed five percent.

As an example, if the current assessed value of all Edgewood properties was \$1,000 with a 2.0 millage rate and the reassessed value was increased \$2,000, the millage rate would fall to 1.0. A five percent windfall limitation would mean the millage at most could be increased to 1.05 following a council

Edgewood's budget will continue to be frugal in the spending of our tax dollars to provide public safety, to repair and maintain Borough infrastructure and to provide other needed services.

How can I find out the percentage changes of Edgewood and neighboring municipality's values?

At this time, Edgewood has not received a certified total value from the County in writing. The Post-Gazette reported the percentages for municipalities in the eastern suburbs in a story on February 7, 2012 www.post-gazette.



com/pg/12034/1207824-56.stm. The Post-Gazette has reported average increases for Allegheny County and the Woodland Hills School District in other articles which you may find through their online search tool.

Why hasn't the Borough passed a resolution that opposes this reassessment?

As we've seen from the inability of the county executive's efforts to stay the reassessments, any resolution made by council on behalf of the residents of Edgewood opposing the reassessment would not change, delay, extend or stop this court-mandated process.

WPJWA is New Sewage Billing Agency

This article was originally printed in the Dec/Jan 11-12 issue of the **Edgewood Newsletter**

Beginning January 1, 2012, Wilkinsburg-Penn Joint Water Authority will become the Sewage-Billing Agent for the Borough. All residents will receive a combined water and sewer bill. In April, residents will receive two bills- one from the current Sewage Billing Agency (Pennsylvania Municipal Service Company-PAMS) and one from Wilkinsburg-Penn Joint Water Authority. The reason for this is that PAMS is billing for water consumption used in the last quarter of 2011 as they have a three-month delay in billing. Wilkinsburg-Penn Joint Water Authority will be billing water and sewer for the most recent threemonth billing period (Jan. through March 2012).

Edgewood is joining 14 other municipalities in the area who now bill sewer and water fees jointly through

WPJWA due to a significant increase in collection rates and simplified billing.

You will receive information in the mail from WPJWA regarding this matter: however, we would like to give residents as much notice as possible to prepare for the two bills they will receive in April.

All outstanding charges billed by PAMS should be paid to PAMS. PAMS will continue to collect delinquent sewage accounts.

Hydrants: Maintenance and Repair

There are 75 fire hydrants in the Borough of Edgewood. The Wilkinsburg-Penn Joint Water Authority (WPJWA) owns, maintains and tests the water flow of hydrants within the Borough and surrounding areas. Testing hydrants is a critical process that is needed to ensure fire departments will have the appropriate water supply when fighting fires. By doing this, WPJWA determines many things:

- The water flow potential in gallons per minute based on data we collect including static (with the hydrant closed) and residual (with the hydrant open and flowing water) pressures
- All moving parts are cleaned, inspected and lubricated
- Hydrant caps are properly secured, and the hydrant is painted
- Hydrants in the area are color coded based on approximate maximum water flow to help firefighters determine how much water can be pumped from a hydrant
- The hydrant is also flushed thoroughly, or allowed to run into the street, and this helps remove any foreign debris such as rocks or other objects which may have found their way into the water system

In addition to water authority maintenance, the fire department performs training exercises involving hydrants on a regular basis. We review standard and unique hydrants, hydrant connections, and supplying water to fire apparatus. Training on the unique hydrants in our area

that have lower flow rates, and nonstandard connections will ensure that the fire department will have adequate water supply to fight fires in the area. Because of the many hills in Edgewood, water pressure and flow varies. Therefore, we may have to use several fire hydrants from adjacent blocks if we cannot get enough water from the first hydrant. The aging water lines in the area are another concern, as there have been fires in recent years where hydrants have failed due to cracking underground lines, even with regular above-ground service.

Citizen Fire Academy

The Edgewood Volunteer Fire Department will be hosting a Citizen Fire Academy in the late spring of 2012. The Academy will give participants a hands- on approach to the fire service. The history of the fire service and principles of fire and home safety are some of the topics that will be covered. Please check our website for more details, www. station137.com.



New Vehicle Laws for Junior Drivers in 2012

We would like to make citizens aware of one of the new vehicle laws for 2012, in the event you may have a "junior driver" in your family: For the first six months after issuance of the junior driver's license, a junior driver shall not drive a vehicle with more than one passenger under 18 years of age who is not a member of the driver's family, unless the junior driver is accompanied by a parent or guardian.

After the expiration of the first six months, a junior driver shall not drive a vehicle with more than three

passengers under 18 years of age who are not members of the driver's immediate family, unless the junior driver is accompanied by a parent or legal guardian.

A junior driver shall not drive a vehicle with more than one passenger under 18 years of age who is not a member of the driver's immediate family unless the junior driver is accompanied by a parent or legal guardian. The term "immediate family" includes brothers, sisters, step-brothers, step-sisters of the driver, including adopted or foster children residing in the same household as the junior driver.

Restraint Systems

It is now a primary offense for any person to drive a vehicle with a passenger under 18 who is not wearing a seat belt or is not properly restrained in a booster or car seat. Other seat belt violations remain secondary offenses. Violations of this section now carry a specific fine of \$75.00

NOTE: Since it is now a PRIMARY VIOLATION, a police officer may stop a vehicle if the officer has probable cause to believe a driver or passenger under 18 years of age is not properly restrained.


Klondike Derby




