#### **Hard-To-Recycle Event**

Since 2003, PRC has held Hard-to-Recycle collections in Southwestern PA with the goal of providing responsible and convenient recycling for items not able to be recycled at the curb. At these events individuals have been able to recycle such item as e-waste, cell phones, polystyrene, compact fluorescent bulbs, alkaline batteries, Freon-containing appliances, tires and more.

Over the past twelve years, 20,000 plus residents have participated in PRC's collection events recycling 1,690,000 pounds of electronics, 8,800 plus tires, 2,400 Freon containing appliances and much more.

PRC partners with local companies to ensure responsible and proper disposal of all materials collected at our events. Our electronic recycler eLoop LLC, a local company based in Plum Borough, is a Basel Action Network e-stewards. As a certified e-steward, eLoop adheres to the highest industry standard for recycling responsibility which ensures no disposal in landfills or incinerators, no prison labor, nor any export of toxics to poor communities. PRC's other Hard to Recycle partners include the Allegheny County Health Department, NOVA Chemicals, and Appliance Warehouse.

TATelcome back, Cibo! After a year-long hiatus while seeking out a new star Head Chef, Cibo, Edgewood's neighborhood trattoria, has re-opened in Regent Square. Sporting new industrial-chic décor and an ever-changing menu of traditional Italian classics with a modern twist, Cibo is certainly an exciting new destination for upscale-casual dining.



Chef Jennifer Buehler-Burfield shared a few stars of the current menu—venison carpaccio, grilled octopus, duck confit, lamb shank and braised rabbit, and, she says "the mussels will be legendary". All the dishes are, of course, made with the Cindy and Dino DeFlavio, Owners freshest possible ingredients, and even the pasta is hand-made in-house.

After a successful soft-opening in February, Cibo is currently taking reservations! Open Wednesday through Sunday from 5pm to "close" (usually 9-10 depending on those dining) they are one of the few restaurants open for Sunday night dining service.

Cindy and Dino DeFlavio continue to enliven Regent Square and Edgewood with Cibo's unique offerings to the neighborhood. They both spoke kindly and highly of the neighborhood, saying "It's a nice place to do business, and we love the local people!"

And the locals seem to love them back! They sport quite a social network following, and now support the local arts community as well! Along with a rotating menu, the dining room will feature changing installations of art from local artists. Currently on display were mixed-media works from Chris McGuinness, a Swissvale resident and member of Rivers of Steel.



There is a lot to experience at Cibo, and we are very excited to have this destination back on our map! Be sure to stop in for the legendary mussels!



#### **Cell Phone Laws in PA**

Using your cell phone while driving can be very dangerous. It is illegal in Pennsylvania to use your cell phone while driving to send or receive **texts**, **emails**, **or messages of any kind**.

If you are caught using your mobile device for any of the above purposes, the PA Department of Transportation will issue you **a \$50 fine**.

It is not illegal to make phone calls while driving. However, if you must make or receive a call while driving, you should:

- Pull off the road whenever possible.
- Use a hands-free device.
- Never participate in emotionally heated conversations.

#### **Pennsylvania Helmet Laws**

#### **Motorcycle Helmet Laws**

You **must wear a motorcycle helmet** in Pennsylvania, UNLESS you are 21 years old or older and have either:

- Had your motorcycle license for at least 2 years.
- Completed a motorcycle safety course approved by the Pennsylvania DOT or the Motorcycle Safety Foundation.

If you are caught riding a motorcycle without your helmet, you will be **fined \$25**.

#### **Helmet Specifications**

Your helmet must be DOT-approved, and must always have the DOT sticker on the back outer shell of the helmet.

Additionally, your helmet must be labeled with the following information:

- Name or ID of the manufacturer.
- Model name and number.
- Size.
- Month and year of manufacture.

#### **Bicycle Helmet Laws**

All children **under 12 years old** must wear a helmet while riding a bicycle or while being towed in a trailer by a bicycle. If your child is caught riding a bike without a helmet, you will receive a **\$25 fine**.

You can have your fine waived if you can show proof of purchase of a helmet before your court date.

While it is not required for everyone to wear a helmet in Pennsylvania, PennDOT strongly recommends you wear an approved helmet at all times while riding a bike.

On December 14, 2015 approximately 25 local residents and historical society members gathered and celebrated the 200th Birthday of Jane Grey Swisshelm at the Edgewood Club Family Room. Several interesting speakers provided information about her life and accomplishments. Allegheny County Councilman, The Honorable Dr. Charles Martoni, presented the society with a proclamation from Allegheny County Council honoring her memory and achievements. Pittsburgh Councilman, The Honorable Corey O'Connor also honored her memory. The Women's Press Club of Pittsburgh sent a letter from their president Stacy Federoff, and a representative from the press club spoke about her accomplishments as a pioneer of women and leading the way for future women journalists. We were also honored to have long time resident Sherman McLaughlin bring a copy of a 1948 essay that he wrote on Jane Grey Swisshelm. The night ended with those in attendance singing happy birthday and giving her a round of applause. A wonderful cake with Jane's picture was donated for the evening by our secretary Janice Leckey. The cake was specially created with Jane's picture on it by The Pastry Chef at the Twentieth Century Club. A good time was had by all!

We had two wonderful archival donations to our society so far this year from residents. Suzan Lami donated a 1926 "COT CLUB COOKBOOK" The cot club was designed to raise money and sponsor a bed at the local hospital. (Good old recipes if anyone is interested.) The second donation came from Mary Shields who donated an old picture and caption of the 1914 Edgewood Tennis Team. They were the 1914 Western Pennsylvania Champions. Two team members had the last name of Garland, which we assume may have been the family that Garland Street was named after.

#### Edgewood Symphony Orchestra

Learn about Beethoven with the ESO!

The ESO is embarking on a five year journey to play all of Beethoven's nine symphonies. To prepare for that amazing musical experience, let's learn more about the man himself.

At the end of the 18th Century, Haydn and Mozart were the most influential composers of the symphony to date, and Beethoven was a young man who was just beginning his career. In 1792, just after Mozart's death, Beethoven, a former student of Haydn, moved to Vienna to pursue his own career in composition. Count Waldstein, an early patron of Beethoven, said that the young composer was to "receive Mozart's spirit from Haydn's hands." In 1795, in an effort to make a name for himself, Beethoven began to write a symphony of his own, but changed

course and began to work on his first piano sonata instead. After four years of focusing on sonatas (he finished eight of his 32 piano sonatas in those years), he went back to work on his symphony. He finished it in early 1800. Reflecting the traditional patterns of Mozart and Haydn, this symphony was youthful and conservative, but it was Beethoven's first big step on a path that would eventually revolutionize classical music.

Hear the ESO perform Beethoven's First Symphony, along with Bach's Second Brandenberg Concerto and Respighi's magnificent Pines of Rome on Saturday, May 7 at 7:30 p.m. at the Pittsburgh JCC. Visit www.edgewoodsymphony.org for tickets and more information.




