

#### **Recycling Best Practices**

Republic Services is Edgewood's Trash Hauler and Recycling Collector. Below find all the information you need to continue to recycle as much as possible. If you have questions regarding Republic Services, call their customer service line at 412-429-2600, or visit their website at www.RepublicServices.com.

## When recycling, ensure your recyclables are EMPTY, CLEAN and DRY.

Please place all of your recyclable materials loosely in your recycling bin. Do NOT put items in plastic bags. NO separating or sorting is needed. We'll do it for you! Here are examples of what you can put in your bin:

### Edgewood Police Department Citizen's Police Academy 2017 Report

Congratulations! The 2017 Citizens Police Academy is officially in the books. Fifteen adults attended the nine week session held every Wednesday evening for three hours at the Western Pennsylvania School for the Deaf, inside the Children's Learning Center. The recent class concluded May 31, 2017 after taking on instruction by professionals in the criminal justice system, both practical and hands-on experience.

Students were transported to Point Park University where Dr. Stimalan provided hands-on forensic, lecture, and crime scene investigations. Students were able to measure blood and piece clues together to solve the various crimes set up inside the Crime Scene House. Chief Doug Cole of the Monroeville Police Department put students through the F.A.T.S. machines providing real life shooting scenarios, enabling them to make split second decisions. The county 911 updated students on the emergency system and the United States Postal Inspector provided details about the function and role of his agency. Students were enlightened by Allegheny County Academy coordinator Bob Metz as he detailed a day inside the Police Academy. Juvenile Court lead prosecutor Meghan Black and Tom Kelly (DA's office) discussed the adult intake and role of the office; Wendy Graham added her experience with the Shuman Center and the probation process.

Deputy Jason Tarap of the Allegheny County Sheriff's Office and Trooper First Class Robyn Mungo provided knowledge of their agencies along with lots of humor. Something new this year was a presentation by Deputy Warden Williams from the Allegheny County Jail. He explained the programs and daily operations within the Department of Corrections. The class changed pace when Chief Payne went back to his days in Homicide, complete with lectures and some jaw dropping slides. Special thanks to Judge Kimberly B. Clark, Administrative Judge of Allegheny County, Juvenile Division, for taking time out of her busy schedule to education the class and pass out important information. The group was awarded another great presentation by Judge Kim M. Hoots, District Justice DC-10. She engaged the class with knowledge, professionalism and extreme humility. Agent Kelly Kochamba of the F.B.I. instructed the students about the bureau along with passing out safety information. Bofta Yiman of WTAE spoke of the importance of police and media relations in the field, and lastly, what class would be complete without a K-9 demonstration. Thank you chief Gheppert for allowing your K-9 team lead by Officer Zakia to share their expertise.

I would like to thank everyone who participated in making this on of the best Citizen's Police Academy Classes that I have ever been a part of. Without you, it would not have been possible.



George Zanic attended the old Edgewood High School, where he starred in football, basketball, and baseball. After graduating from EHS in 1956, George graduated from the University of Pittsburgh in 1960. George earned All-America honors at Pitt as a soccer goalie and also played varsity baseball. He served in the Navy and then taught and coached for two years at Southside Beaver High School in Hookstown, PA before returning to Edgewood.

George joined the Edgewood High faculty in the fall of 1967 as a teacher and as the head football and basketball coach. Fifty years ago the very first EHS team he coached was the undefeated football squad that will be honored on August 19.

George stayed at Edgewood and later Woodland Hills for the remainder of his career. He eventually coached almost 100 teams in nine separate boys and girls sports in 32 years. He lived in Edgewood for over 40 years before moving to Florida several years ago. He and Mary raised their sons George and Van in Edgewood and are now proud grandparents. George and Mary are excited to return for this dinner and they are looking forward to seeing folks.

many more years with this beloved Coach.






#### Weekly Celebration—ALL INVITED

#### A note from the real estate tax collector...

#### PLEASE NOTE TAX OFFICE **HOUR CHANGE**

Beginning July 1, 2017, the tax office will now be open Tuesdays and Thursdays from 9 a.m. until 1 p.m. I will no longer be in on Mondays and Wednesdays. My office will be closed August 7-11.

The 2017 Edgewood Borough Real Estate tax is now due at penalty until December 5, 2017 and will be turned over to the delinquent tax collector by the end of the year.

The 2017 Woodland Hills School tax was mailed out July 1st and is due at discount until August 31. If you are paying in installments, the dates are October 31, January 31 and March 31. I will have extended hours the last two weeks of the school discount period. My hours will be August 21-25 and August 28-31 from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. If you have not received your bill, changed addresses or changed mortgage companies, contact my office at 412-731-0200 so I can mail one out to you.

When you pay your taxes please make sure you are paying the correct amount, that the written and numerical portions of your check match and that you have signed and dated you check! If your check is returned for errors or missing information by the appropriate due dates, you will be charged into the next period. Your check must be postmarked by August 31st to receive the 2% discount. If you use your banks on-line payment services, please allow enough lag time so your payment is received by the due date. Remember to include your statement with your payment and if you need a receipt please include a self-addressed stamped envelope.
