Only the arborist can determine if the roots can be safely trimmed to help prolong both the tree and sidewalk.

Edgewood Recycles

Some basic notes on recycling:

- 1. RECYCLE ONLY PLASTICS # 1 and # 2.** New limitations on acceptable materials means #3-#7 are no longer acceptable and will be discarded. Make sure containers are clean, dry, and lids are removed.
- 2. DO NOT PLACE RECYCLING IN PLASTIC BAGS.** Bagged recyclables will NOT be recycled. Bags tangle and damage the sorting equipment.
- 3. MAKE SURE RECYCLABLES ARE CLEAN AND DRY.** Food material CANNOT be recycled! That means old pizza boxes covered in grease can't be recycled. And make sure that jar of peanut butter has been cleaned and dried before putting it in your blue bin!
- 4. YOU CAN RECYCLE ELECTRONICS AND BATTERIES IN EDGEWOOD!** Just call Republic Services at 412-429-2600 or visit their website at RepublicServices.com to set up a Hard-To-Recycle pickup at your home. You MUST arrange a special pickup for these items, but it's very easy to do! Take advantage of this great program to get rid of your old electronics, batteries and light bulbs!
- 5. RECYCLING MAKES A DIFFERENCE.** We do calculate the tonnage of recycling in Edgewood each year, and there are HUNDREDS of tons of waste that bypass the landfill in favor of recycling! Keep up the good work, Edgewood!

The focus of the Edgewood Police Department is to make sure all of the children get to school safely, remain safe in school, and get home safely.

Traffic is the major issue when it comes to keeping everyone safe. There will be school buses traveling all around the area and making frequent stops. Drivers need to pay attention when the buses activate the yellow and red lights. The fine for failing to stop for a school bus's activated red signal is \$250, plus costs, and could result in the loss of your driver's license. The monetary loss could be devastating, but nowhere near as devastating as injuring a child.

All school zones are clearly posted and have a 15 mile per hour speed limit. If you choose to exceed this speed limit, you will be subject to greater fines and penalties.

The Edgewood Police Department takes the safety of our school children very seriously! There will be extra patrols in school zones, both in the mornings and afternoon. We urge everyone to please slow down and pay attention! If you do not, we will be forced to remind you.

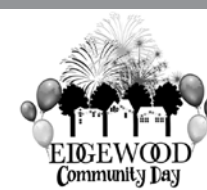

Art Night in Edgewood

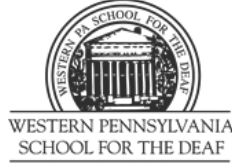
