2024 Parking Permits


Residents are now able to enter their information and pay for an overnight parking permit online. Permits will be mailed to purchasers thereby eliminating the need to appear in person to buy a permit at the borough building. Resident and visitor parking passes go on sale Monday, December 4, 2023. Passes can be purchased at www.edgewoodboro.com/parkingpermits.

Each driver with a vehicle registered in the Borough is able to purchase a Residential on-street parking pass. A Visitor's pass may also be purchased. Visitor passes may not be used on any vehicle registered within the Borough. The fees for on-street parking permits and Borough off-street lots will be posted after council's budget meeting in mid-November. Passes are no longer offered for recreational vehicle storage at the borough building lot.


Applications for the Borough's off-street parking lots will be accepted starting on December 4, 2023. On December 18, 2023, permits will be issued based upon requests. A lottery will be held If more applications are received than there are available parking spaces. No resident will be issued a second permit until all initial requests are processed.

Flu Shot Clinic Cancelled

Eastern Area Prehospital Services or EAPS, the EMS agency that administers the flu vaccine program at Edgewood Borough, was not allocated any flu vaccines this year. Therefore, EAPS recommends anyone wanting a flu vaccine this year should seek one from a pharmacy or their doctors office.







Koenig Field Reservations

Groups or individuals engaged in an organized (i.e. leagues, social clubs, amateur associations, etc) sporting activity are required to apply for and receive a field use permit. Individuals or groups wanting dedicated tennis or pickleball court time are encouraged to reserve their desired space to ensure access. Establishing a field use permit system ensures that field space is available for both groups and individuals to maximize recreational opportunities while ensuring equity amongst all users.

Scheduling preference will be given to Edgewood residents and then to other leagues, groups, clubs and associations. All facilities are open to the public unless otherwise reserved for organized use. The public may use all other parts of Koenig Field at any time that are not reserved for organized play.

A fee schedule has been created, in order to best manage regular upkeep and maintenance on borough facilities. Fees may be waived by Edgewood Borough Council on a case-by-case basis. Refunds will be given at the discretion of the borough in instances of bad weather where playing during or immediately after could damage the field, or if the borough unilaterally cancels a reservation.

Fall Leaf Collection

Annual leaf collection starts Monday, October 30, 2023. Residents must not place leaves at the curb until this time. Leaves left at the curb for an extended period of time are very difficult to vacuum and slow down the collection process since they soak up water and become compacted from vehicle traffic. Help our public works department by keeping your leaves in your yard until the day before they're scheduled for collection. Doing so ensures that everyone's leaves are collected in a timely manner. Thursday is a catch up day. Public works uses this day to go back over any streets needing extra cleaning or that they couldn't complete earlier in the week.

Property owners that routinely place piles of leaves in the street days before their scheduled collection day may be subject to enforcement action for creating an unsafe condition. Collection delays and cancellations will be posted on the borough marquis, phone system and our Facebook page and website.





OUT OF THIS FURNACE Historical Marker funded by Woodland Hills Foundation

Woodland Hills High School library media specialist Mr. Kevin McGuire spent several years working with the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission to create a historical marker dedicated to "Out of This Furnace," Thomas Bell's 1941 novel about three generations of immigrant workers living and working in Braddock.

On Thursday, September 28, the marker was finally unveiled just outside of the Edgar Thomson Steel Works on Braddock Avenue.

The text reads, "OUT OF THIS FURNACE: Set mainly in Braddock, Thomas Bell's 1941 novel follows three generations of an immigrant Slovak family here. Bell drew on personal history, including a job at the Edgar Thomson Steel Works, to create the vivid depiction of working-class life in industrial Pittsburgh."

Following the unveiling of the historical marker, guests were invited to a reception at the Black Box Theater across the street. There, Mr. McGuire introduced several guest speakers, including Dr. Andy Masich from the Heinz History Center and Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission; state representative Abigail Salisbury, whose district includes Braddock and North Braddock; Dr. Nicholas Coles from the University of Pittsburgh; and Steffi Domike of United Steelworkers. The event ended with Woodland Hills High School students Mariah Helvy and Mackenzie O'Neil reading a selection from the novel.
