From The Manager's Desk

Fall Leaf Collection

Annual leaf collection starts Monday October 30, 2023. Residents must not place leaves at the curb until this time. Leaves left at the curb for an extended period of time are very difficult to vacuum and slow down the collection process since they soak up water and become compacted from vehicle traffic. Help our public works department by keeping your leaves in your yard until the day before they're scheduled for collection. Doing so ensures that everyone's leaves are collected in a timely manner. Thursday is a catch up day. Public works uses this day to go back over any streets needing extra cleaning or that they couldn't complete earlier in the week.

Property owners that routinely place piles of leaves in the street days before their scheduled collection day may be subject to enforcement action for creating an unsafe condition. Collection delays and cancellations will be posted on the borough marquis, phone system and our Facebook page and website.

DLCO "Smart" Street Lighting Project

Duquesne Light recently completed their "Smart" Street Lighting project in Edgewood Borough. The purpose of this project was to replace all of the older sodium vapor street lights with new LED lights and add a Smart controller to each light. The controller automatically notifies Duquesne Light of a problem with the light and can adjust the brightness of the light depending on the time of day and weather conditions.

Although the new Smart controller will automatically notify Duquesne Light of a malfunctioning street light, residents can continue to report malfunctioning street lights electronically by visiting https://www.duquesnelight.com/customer-support/streetlight-outages. Please note, submitting a report will not guarantee a faster response time but it will allow Duquesne Light to confirm that a problem exists and service is needed.

Back to School

Just a few reminders, as the school year gets into gear:

• The focus of the Edgewood Police Department is to make sure all of the children get to school safely, remain safe in school, and get home safely.



- There will be school buses traveling all around the area and making frequent stops. Drivers need to pay attention when buses activate the yellow and red lights. The fine for failing to stop for a school bus's activated red signal is \$250.00, plus costs, and could result in the loss of your driver's license. The monetary loss could be devastating, but nowhere near as devastating as injuring a child.
- All school zones are clearly posted and have a 15 mile per hour speed limit. If you choose to exceed this speed limit, you will be subject to greater fines and penalties.

In addition, with construction projects taking place at the school this year, parking could be more limited, and congestion on Maple Ave may be increased. Drivers may wish to consider an alternate route during school arrival and dismissal times.


The Edgewood Police Department takes the safety of our school children very seriously!

Yard Signs

With the November election coming up soon, we expect that yard signs will be prevalent around the area. That leaves the question of what to do with those signs once the election is over. Unfortunately, these are generally not able to be accepted for curbside recycling, as #3 - #7 plastics are considered trash. There are some alternatives though to sending these to a landfill. Some signs may be able to be recycled at an accepting drop-off location. For instance, Signs N' At in Edgewood accepts #4 plastic. Some campaigns may take their signs back (please check with them individually, as this may vary). Another option is to re-use the sign. You could paint over it and use it for your own message or artwork. We hope these ideas will encourage everyone to help keep Edgewood green and clean.

Parkway Interchange Landscape Maintenance

Special thanks to the Western Pennsylvania Conservancy and all of the volunteers who helped maintain the Edgewood Parkway Interchange site through the growing season! The last bit of clean up for the year will take place Wednesdays and Saturdays through mid-September. The start time is 9am and should last about 1.5 hrs. Volunteers should be fourteen or older.

WPC provides gloves, buckets and trash bags. Gardening tools will be available, but anyone is welcome to bring their own if preferred. Volunteers need to dress for safety (closed-toes shoes, pants, shirt, hat, sunscreen) and appropriately for the weather. Everyone should bring their own water.



Pittsburgh East CROP Walk



Koenig Field Off-Season Info

Reservations for the field and tennis/pickleball courts are accepted from April 1-November 15. The tennis/pickleball courts, restrooms and water fountains are closed to the public outside of the dates listed above. Other areas of the field may still be used for off-season personal and recreational use.

Koenig Field Reservations

Groups or individuals engaged in an organized (i.e. leagues, social clubs, amateur associations, etc) sporting activity are required to apply for and receive a field use permit. Individuals or groups wanting dedicated tennis or pickleball court time are encouraged to reserve their desired space to ensure access. Establishing a field use permit system ensures that field space is available for both groups and individuals to maximize recreational opportunities while ensuring equity amongst all users.

Scheduling preference will be given to Edgewood residents and then to other leagues, groups, clubs and associations. All facilities are open to the public unless otherwise reserved for organized use. The public may use all other parts of Koenig Field at any time that are not reserved for organized play.

A fee schedule has been created, in order to best manage regular upkeep and maintenance on borough facilities. Fees may be waived by Edgewood Borough Council on a case-by-case basis. Refunds will be given at the discretion of the borough in instances of bad weather where playing during or immediately after could damage the field, or if the borough unilaterally cancels a reservation.



Woodland Hills Renovations Update

Please excuse our dust! The Woodland Hills School District is excited about ongoing renovations to Edgewood Elementary STEAM Academy. The district recently approved a series of much-needed upgrades to the exterior of the building, including significant changes that will enhance the safety and security of students and staff.

Phase One of the project was approved by the school board this summer and will last throughout the school year. This phase includes a new security vestibule that visitors will be required to use to enter the building, ensuring that no one will be able to enter without being cleared by security staff. It also includes the creation of a dedicated bus drop-off area in front of the main entrance. The drop-off area will create a safer environment for students to get on and off of their buses, as well as alleviate some of the congestion on Maple Avenue during arrival and dismissal. Phase One also includes renovations to the brick and underlying exterior support structures, new windows, and more.

The district also approved a separate project to install a new HVAC system that will modernize the building's heating and cooling. Additional interior renovations would be part of Phase Two of the project. Those plans are currently being discussed and reviewed by district administrators and the school board. The Woodland Hills School District appreciates the patience and understanding of area residents during the construction process, and asks that all neighbors and visitors please be mindful of any fencing or roped off areas to ensure their safety.




