

# Storm Recap

On the evening of Tuesday, April 29, a substantial storm system swept through the Pittsburgh region, causing notable damage in the Borough of Edgewood and surrounding communities. Duquesne Light, in conjunction with tree removal companies, worked for days to restore services, utilizing additional crews that were brought in from other areas around the country.

As we are only at the beginning of the Spring and Summer storm season, we are taking this opportunity to provide a reminder on best practices for potential emergent situations. Please follow local news stations and alerts for information on weather conditions and hazards. Please take these alerts seriously as your safety is our priority. If you need assistance or become aware of any hazard, please use 911 to notify first responders. In the wake of a natural disaster, please avoid unnecessary travel as conditions such as downed powerlines and loose tree limbs on and above roadways could be hazardous to the general public. Treat all power lines as though they are energized and notify 911 immediately should you discover one. Do not go near any downed lines and move at least 30 feet away to a safe location BEFORE attempting to notify 911.

It will take several months to completely recover from the April 29 storms and we appreciate everyone's patience as cleanup efforts continue.

# **Residential Tree Management**

In the wake of the severe weather, now is a good time to assess your own property for potentially dangerous large trees and consult a licensed arborist about their long-term viability. Our large and beautiful trees are a defining characteristic of the borough, but they can also cause tremendous damage when they fall. The borough is working with its arborist to evaluate numerous street trees and encourages homeowners to do the same. While removing an old growth tree is always difficult, a new tree can be planted in its place. The same cannot always be said for a damaged home or garage and all the irreplaceable personal property they contain.

# **SOLICITING**

Edgewood Borough requires anyone canvassing or soliciting within the Borough of Edgewood to obtain a permit. A permit must be obtained by visiting the Edgewood Borough building during business hours, 9 a.m.-4 p.m.

For the safety of our residents, all approved individuals will carry on their person a permit issued by Edgewood Borough. The permit will contain the company, business, or non-profit the individual is working for. The permit will also contain the name of the person soliciting.

If any person knocks on your door selling, soliciting merchandise or requesting money, who does not have a permit, please call 911 and request an officer so that we may check the legitimacy of their actions.

# **Fighting Against Corruption**

am extremely concerned about corruption in our government. So I'm working hard to root it out. Our government should be delivering for all of us—the good people of Western PA and this great country.

Did you know that it's perfectly legal for Members of Congress to trade stocks while in office (even if they learn sensitive information in Congress)? I think it's outrageous and should be illegal. As part of our jobs, congressmembers have access to sensitive insider information—things that can have significant impacts on markets and stock valuations.

We're elected to serve the interests of the people, and nobody should line their own pockets by abusing power to play the stock market.

That's why I'm proud to co-sponsor <u>bipartisan legislation</u> to ban Congressional stock trading—the *Transparent Representation Upholding Service and Trust* (TRUST) in Congress Act.





# **Edgewood construction continues to progress**

Work is progressing on the renovations at Edgewood Elementary STEAM Academy. The construction crew has completed all of the work on the roof and the majority of the work on the exterior masonry. The driveway should have asphalt laid down by the end of April. The crew will work with the Woodland Hills School District facilities team to go through the punch list and complete remaining tasks for the first phase of construction. Work will continue through the spring and summer.



# Woodland Hills elementary robotics team qualifies for 2025 VEX IQ World Championships in Dallas

A team of elementary students from the Woodland Hills School District will be taking their robotics skills to the world stage thanks to their performance at a recent state competition.

On Tuesday, March 4, the IQ Pandas won the top two awards at the 2025 Western Pennsylvania VEX IQ Robotics Competition State Championships at Clarion University. Featuring fifth graders Julian Ault, Emmett Brubaker, Tate Norman, and Parker Yatsko from Edgewood Elementary STEAM Academy, the IQ Pandas are the first team from Woodland Hills to reach the world championship stage.

At the Western Pennsylvania State Championships, the IQ Pandas won the first place Teamwork Challenge Award, which is awarded to the top al-

liance that works together to earn the highest combined driver's score in a competition. They also won the Excellence Award, which rewards a team for its ability to document and explain their design process, as well as demonstrate an outstanding competition performance.

The 2025 VEX Robotics World Championships will be held May 12 through May 14 at the Kailey Bay Hutchison Convention Center in Dallas. The event will feature competitors from over fifty countries.



# Edgewood third graders collaborate with peers from Western Pennsylvania School for the Deaf

Ms. Dietrich, Ms. Seigfreid, and Mr. Sharp have been taking a group of third grade students to visit their friends and neighbors at the Western Pennsylvania School for the Deaf throughout 2025 to collaborate with the use of VEX Robotics kits. The students have been working together on a cross-curricular reading activity to share their knowledge with each other. Third and fourth graders from the Western Pennsylvania School for the Deaf have been helping the

Edgewood students learn American Sign Language, while the Edgewood students have been showcasing all they know about VEX Robotics.

Ms. Seigfreid, who is a reading specialist at Edgewood, has helped Edgewood partner with their neighbors in the past for previous collaborations. This time, she had the idea of building upon Woodland Hills' inclusion of VEX Robotics in its curriculum. Middle school and high school students at the Western Pennsylvania School for the Deaf also use VEX Robotics, and this has been an opportunity to introduce the concepts to younger students. Meanwhile, Edgewood students have enjoyed a fantastic opportunity to discover new ways to communicate and share ideas.

# **Edgewood PTA hosts STEM Night for families**

The Edgewood PTA hosted a STEM night for families at Dickson Preparatory STEAM Academy. With the construction going on at Edgewood Elementary, students and families were able to utilize the space at Dickson to explore a wide range of concepts related to science, technology, engineering, and math. From scoping out new books about those subjects to conducting science experiments to test driving VEX Robotics kits to exploring the foundations of engineering, students and families were able to explore a bunch of different stations and activities.



Teachers, staff, and volunteers helped out at each activity, introducing students to elemental botany, buoyancy, pressure/combustion, and so much more. They were able to showcase their creative sides along with their scientific minds! The event was made possible thanks to a grant from the National PTA. Thanks to everyone who came together to help make it possible. We hope the students and families had a blast!

# Rob Gronkowski, U.S. Steel to give Woodland Hills weight room renovations a lift

Rob Gronkowski played on some of the most successful and talented teams in NFL history. Over the last few months, the Woodland Hills High School alum formed another highly successful team to help give his alma mater a lift.

Thanks to donations from Gronkowski, U.S. Steel, and State Senator Jay Costa, Woodland Hills was able to renovate its weight room and fitness center to give its



student-athletes a boost against the competition. Gronkowski and his team from Gronk Fitness, representatives from U.S. Steel, and the Woodland Hills athletic department formally reopened the fitness center during a ribbon cutting ceremony on Tuesday, April 8.

Gronkowski donated \$200,000 through his foundation, which was then matched by U.S. Steel, to help fund the rehabilitation effort. Senator Costa also helped Woodland Hills secure additional funding for the project. Through Gronkowski's "Gronk Fitness" brand, the Gronkowski family helped supply Woodland Hills with all new equipment, from free weights to rowing machines and more. The upgrades replaced aging equipment, some of which predated Gronkowski's graduation from Woodland Hills High School in 2007. The facility will be open for all students to use.
