

HISTORY UPDATED: An old postcard view of East Swissvale Avenue shows the storefronts now owned by Lami Grubb Architects. The firm has just finished renovating the space formerly known as "The Druggie," including a restoration of the original tin ceiling. The drugstore served railroad patrons and sold penny candy to Edgewood Elementary students. Dick Lithgow was the last proprietor of The Druggie, and his daughter, Susan Lithgow says he served there as an unofficial counselor to the youth of Edgewood. Historical Society President David Grubb says that the building was built by Charles S. Johnston, who ran a meat market in what is now part of the architectural firm. Also in the space was Pete Nuzzo's Shoe Repair, now run by his grandson.




## Newsletter

#### **Fund Drive**

At the time you receive this newsletter you should have also received a fund drive notice in the mail from the EVFD. The yearly fund drive is necessary for us to continue to purchase equipment needed to provide the best fire and rescue protection possible. Although the borough does maintain the vehicles it's the EVFD that equips the vehicles with the tools needed to perform our job and provide protective clothing to the members. Unlike other departments in the area, we do not have bingos, sell monthly raffle tickets or have fish fries. We really on our funding from the community day dinner, luminaria and the fund drive. Trust me - we do not sell enough dinners or luminaria to sustain the department. Fire equipment is expensive. Recently a gate that is used to connect the hose to the pump was found to be leaking due to wear. To replace this gate the cost is \$3000. Unlike other departments we have recently experienced a growth spurt of four new members. With growth comes expense: bunker gear. A helmet alone cost us \$200. I am well aware of how often we are asked to send support to one organization or another but I ask that you please make a donation so that we can continue to provide the best service to the citizens of Edgewood.

The EVFD welcome three new faces to the department: Eric Silverman, Tom Dzambo, and Eben Teisher. Tom and Eben are new borough residents and have fire-fighting experience. Eric is certified as an EMT but wanted to learn the fire-fighting end of public safety. Eben and Tom are both firefighters from other departments and are now Edgewood residents. This brings a total of four new members in a month, a new Edgewood record!




#### Buckle Up PA

Edgewood officers participated in Buckle Up Pennsylvania's Click It or Ticket Program from September 23 through September 30. During this time officers conducted seat belt checks throughout the borough. A minicade checkpoint was set up on Maple Avenue at the Edgewood Primary School. Cars were checked for seatbelt usage while going through the school zone before and after school. During the program contact was made with 9,556 vehicles. The purpose of this program is to boost awareness on the importance of wearing seatbelts.









#### **Activity Report**

The Edgewood Police Department responded to and handled 2,027 calls for service in September 2007. There were 668 incidents reported, 271 complaints received and four accidents investigated, one of which resulted in personal injury, and three of which resulted in property damage.

Part I Crimes are the more serious crimes of homicide, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft and arson. Of the 19 Part I Crimes committed in the borough, one was burglary, 10 were shoplifting, and eight were other crimes.

There were 13 adult and three juvenile arrests made for felony and misdemeanor violations.

Edgewood officers wrote a total of 121 traffic citations, 281 parking citations and made three arrests for driving under the influence. There were two vandalism/criminal mischief complaints and one narcotics offense.

Officers also responded to 13 false alarm calls, took 397 reports, responded to 22 public nuisance complaints, wrote one non-traffic citation and responded to 18 calls for medical assistance.
