## **2022 Parking Permits**

Resident on-street and visitor on-street parking permits go on sale Wednesday December 1, 2021. Permits can be purchased online at http://www.edgewood.pgh. pa.us/edgewood-parkingpermits. Permits will be mailed to purchasers thereby eliminating the need to appear in person to buy a permit at the borough building. On-street permits costs remain unchanged for 2022 at \$25 each. Off-street borough parking lot permits cost \$60 and spaces at the borough building are \$150 for commercial vehicles and \$240 for recreational vehicles or trailers.

Permits for the Ivy Street, Laurel Street, Oakview Avenue, and Willow Place offstreet parking lots will be made available for purchase based upon requests starting on Monday, December 13, 2021. Residents interested in purchasing an off-street lot permit should submit their completed permit application to the borough on or before Monday December 13, 2021. If more applications are received than there are available parking spaces, a lottery will be held. No resident will be issued a second permit for a lot until all initial requests are processed.

#### Trash collection

Trash collection and recycling services will again be provided by Republic Services. The collection day remains Thursday with recycling being collected every other week. The glass recycling container will remain in the borough building rear parking lot for those wishing to recycle their clean glass containers. Any curbside recycling containers containing glass will not be collected as part of the recycling run. Please contact Republic Services at 1-800-464-2120 with questions regarding collection, billing, or to schedule bulk, e-waste, or household hazardous waste collection.

## 2022 Budgets

Borough Council will hold a public hearing at 7 p.m. on December 6, 2021 for public comment regarding the 2022 General Fund, Sewer Fund, and Highway Budgets. The 2022 property tax rate remains unchanged at 7.185 mills and no new fees are proposed. Overall, the general fund budget balances with revenues and expenses totaling \$3.65 million. Copies of all budgets are available for review on the borough's website or in-person at the C.C. Mellor Library and Edgewood Borough Building.

## **Overnight Parking Rules**

A parking permit is needed to park on a public roadway in Edgewood Borough between 3 to 5 a.m. Parking permits can be purchased online at http://www. edgewoodboro.com/edgewood-parkingpermits. Permits purchased online will be mailed to the purchaser. Residents are strongly encouraged to utilize the online purchasing option to limit person to person contact at the borough building. Those who do not have computer access may still purchase a pass at the Edgewood Borough building between 8 a.m. to 10 p.m., Monday through Friday.

The cost for a yearly, on street parking pass is \$25. A visitor pass can also be purchased for \$25. To purchase an on street parking permit you must have a valid PA vehicle registration and proof of insurance.

Once you purchase a permit sticker, please adhere it to THE LOWER LEFT CORNER OF THE BACK WINDOW. The permit is to be placed on the OUT-SIDE of the window so that it can be visible at night. Most sport utility vehicles are equipped with factory tinted rear windows. Our officers will NOT be able to see your permit if you place it on the inside of your window. This will result in you receiving a parking ticket. Officers check every vehicle in Edgewood Borough and you will receive a parking ticket if your permit is not in the correct location. Once an officer has written a parking ticket and walks up to your vehicle, it is too late if he/she notices a permit or visitors permit lying on the dashboard.

The visitor permit is made to hang on your rear view mirror. Officers understand that there is a small percentage of vehicles that this will not work on. Officers suggest utilizing a rubber band to temporarily attach it to the mirror so that it is visible. Once again, you will receive a parking ticket if the officer does not see a permit on your rear view mirror.

On the parking ticket, there is a box that can be checked that reads, "Prohibited truck parking midnight—6 a.m." This section refers to commercial vehicles, trailers, and similar equipment. No vehicle may be parked on an Edgewood Borough street that is used in the furtherance of a business. This would be vehicles that have advertising on them, ladder racks, tool boxes, etc. This section also applies to work trailers, recreational type trailers, boats, etc. These types of trailers are not permitted to be left on the roadways or left overnight while still attached to the vehicle.

The Edgewood Volunteer Fire Department needs your help! We are currently in need of more residents from within the Borough of Edgewood to join its ranks.

An alarming statistic to bring to light is that out of thirty members on our roster, only three live within the borough. And of that thirty, just like most volunteer fire departments, only about a third makes up a small core that are your everyday people keeping the organization running—with those three Edgewood residents within the small core we just mentioned. Without enough personnel that live within the community, there is a more significant delay in getting our resources where they are needed because people are coming from further distances.

We have several different membership types and are looking for firefighters, medically trained personnel such as EMTs or Paramedics, and even administrative members to help with fund-raisers, events and writing. Interested in joining but have no formal background in fire, rescue or EMS? We have plenty of training opportunities available.

We also have a live-in program where individuals can live at the fire station rent free, and in return receive training and dedicate more time to answering calls. This program was created to try to combat the issue of members traveling long distances, so the live-ins can help us get to calls quicker. Our live-in quarters were just recently renovated and we offer many amenities. At this moment, we only have one live-in member and are looking for more.

# Upstream Eco-Friendly Options for Sidewalk Salt pittsburgh

The weather has begun to change and soon we will soon be seeing ice and snow covering our neighborhoods. Each winter, sidewalk salt is a useful tool for protecting our sidewalks, streets, and driveways from ice. But how does sidewalk salt impact our environment and waterways, and is there a better alternative? Well, we at Upstream Pittsburgh are here to provide some research, and help you to have a more environmentally friendly and low-impact season!

Recent research indicates that excess salt is accumulating in the environment and poses an emerging threat both to ecosystems and human health. Over the past 50 years, salinity has increased in 37% of drainage areas across the contiguous United States, and it seems as if sidewalk and road salt is the dominant source. A 2014 study by the U.S. Geological Survey found that 84% of the urban streams studied had rising chloride levels, and 29% exceeded federal safety guidelines for at least part of the year. Private drinking water wells have been affected by sidewalk salt too. Sodium levels above the EPA's health standard have been discovered in private drinking water wells in areas close to heavy salting. Additionally, the toxins contained in namebrand sidewalk salts can be damaging to concrete and can rust and corrode the paint on cars.

Sidewalk salt also negatively impacts aquatic life. 40% of urban streams in the U.S. already have chloride levels that exceed safe guidelines for aquatic life. High chloride levels in water can inhibit aquatic species' growth and reproduction and impact their food sources. Sidewalk salt runoff can also lead to oxygen depletion within a waterway, depriving aquatic life of sufficient levels of oxygen to survive.

So, how can you protect both the environment and your sidewalk? There are a number of eco-friendly alternatives to rock salt (sodium chloride, the most toxic type of salt). Many stores, such as Lowe's and Whole Foods, sell organic de-icers that use calcium chloride, magnesium chloride or calcium magnesium acetate, a totally salt-free alternative. Though these products may be a little pricier, you are paying for quality and environmental safety. These alternative de-icers properly protect your driveway from ice without the use of toxins found in rock salt. As an added bonus, most of these alternative de-icers are also pet friendly, and do significantly less damage to paw pads than rock salt does, while taking walks around the neighborhood in winter. Get ready to bundle up and hopefully have an environmentally friendly and ice free season!
