President Schaefer called the meeting of the Borough of Edgewood to order at 7:38 pm in the Municipal Building.

ROLL CALL

Upon roll call, the following responded: Mr. Bright, Mr. Wilson, Mr. Fuller and Ms. Schaefer. Dr. Petrolla arrived at 7:45 pm.

Mayor Cook and Solicitor Barry were also present.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

ITEMS FROM THE FLOOR

Andrea Maue - 206 Elm Street

Ms. Maue gave the monthly report for the Edgewood Foundation. She discussed the successful Community Day. She said Oktoberfest would take place on October 7th at Koenig Field and would have a pig roast this year. Tickets are available now.

M-1 Mr. Fuller moved to approve the minutes of August 21, 2017. Second by Mr. Wilson.

PENSION Mr. Bright said the committee met with Oakmont Capital to go over the pension plans' performance in the second quarter of 2017, and reported that the investments were doing well.

AD HOC COMMITTEES

3 RIVERS WET WEATHER DEMONSTRATION PROJECT/CONNECT Ms. Schaefer said the 3 Rivers Wet Weather conference was October 11th and 12th. Ms. Bastianini said a CONNECT friendsraiser event was scheduled for October.

SOLICITOR'S REPORT Mr. Barry said he was in the process of finalizing provisions for the Borough to accept a parcel of property from Oxford Development.

BOROUGH MANAGER'S REPORT Ms. Bastianini reported on the Borough's completed paving projects. She certified the 2018 Minimum Municipal Obligation for the pension plans to Council. The 2018 MMO is \$157,466. She discussed the Tri-Cog Land Bank and how a vacant property in Edgewood was a finalist for acquisition. She said PennDOT was holding a meeting for elected official on September 28th from 10 am-12 pm in Churchill to discuss the parkway east. She said ALCOSAN was holding public officials briefings on September 25th at 6 pm and October 4th at 8 am at the Forest Hills Westinghouse Lodge.

NEW BUSINESS A community services committee meeting was scheduled for September 26th at 6 pm.
