RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF EDGEWOOD, ALLEGHENY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA (hereinafter "the municipality").

WHEREAS Section 5 of the Act of January 24, 1966, P.L. 1535, No. 537, known as the *Pennsylvania Sewage Facilities Act*, as Amended, and the rules and Regulations of the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) adopted thereunder, Chapter 71 of Title 25 of the Pennsylvania Code, require the municipality to adopt an Official Sewage Facilities Plan providing for sewage services adequate to prevent contamination of waters of the Commonwealth and/or environmental health hazards from sewage wastes, and to revise said plan whenever it is necessary to determine whether a proposed method of sewage disposal for a new land development conforms to a comprehensive program of pollution control and water quality management, and

WHEREAS Northpoint Development, LLC. has proposed the development of a parcel of land identified as

Beyond Self-Storage Facility Towne Centre Drive -lot D-2, and described in the attached Sewage Facilities Planning Module, and proposes that such subdivision be served by: (check all that apply), \(\subseteq \) sewer tap-ins, \(\subseteq \) sewer extension, I new treatment facility, I individual onlot systems, I community onlot systems, I spray irrigation, retaining tanks, dother, (please specify).
